from the pastor's desk:

Do you know how a worm gets inside an apple? Most people think that it burrows in from the outside, but that is not the case. The fact is, the worm actually comes from the inside. So how is it possible for a worm to be inside an apple without it coming from the outside?

Here is how. When the apple blossom is on the tree, an insect comes along and lays an egg in it. As the apple starts growing, the egg hatches inside the heart of the apple. The worm comes out of the egg in the middle of the apple, and then it tunnels its way out. This is a picture of how thoughts get inside our hearts.

If we do not keep and quard our hearts diligently, we become too preoccupied with unprofitable, inexpedient, negative, impure thoughts, attitudes, and behavior, (i.e. an egg is laid). If we do not immediately reject it, the thought will stay there and grow inside our hearts. Once it is on the inside, it will eventually burrow its way out through our attitudes, words, and actions. Jesus said, "For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, slanders" (Matt. 15:19).

Two ways that I have found that can keep the egg from being planted or growing into a worm is to continually pray and read, meditate and memorize Scripture.

We can pattern our prayers after King David's prayers when he prayed: "search me, O God, and know my heart" (Psalm 139:23 KJV) and "create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me" (Psalm 51:10 KJV). Staying in constant communication with God is the key.

Secondly, we need to make sure we are reading, meditating and memorizing



Scripture. "I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you" (Psalm 119:11) is a primary reason for studying and memorizing Scripture. Memorizing these truths will come to our mind when we need them the most. Remember while Jesus was fasting and praying for forty days he was tempted by Satan, each of the three temptations was combated by the Scripture he memorized. We must **guard our hearts** with prayer and Scripture. "Guard your heart above all else, for out of it flow the springs of life" (Prov. 4:23).
